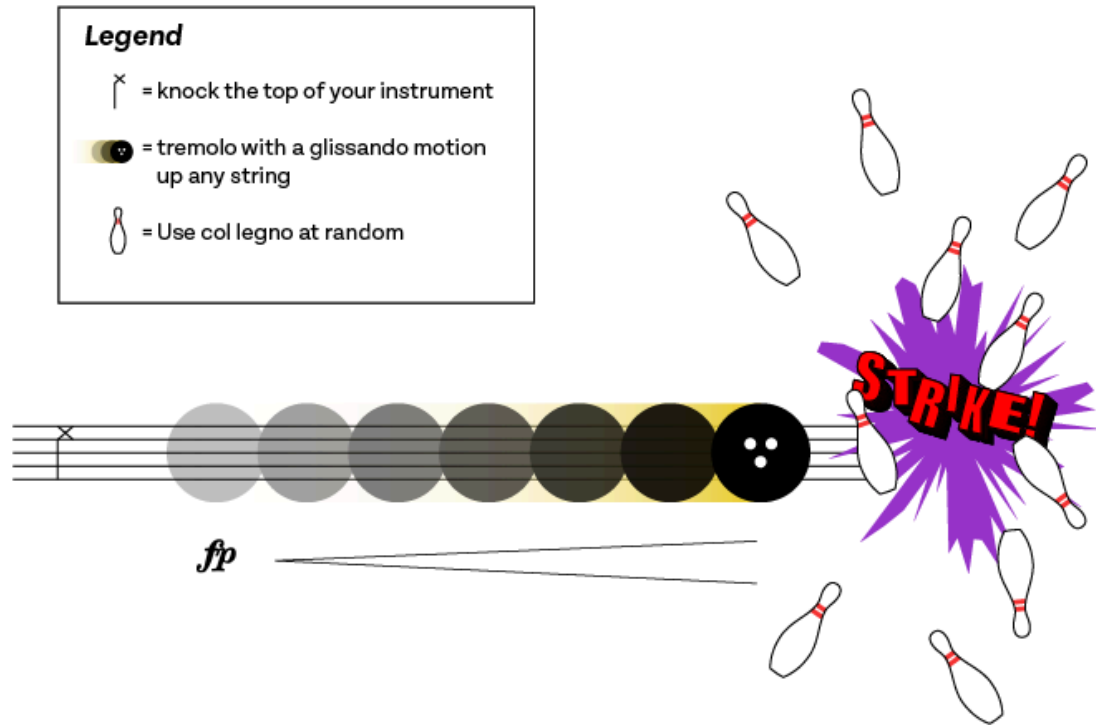




GRAPHIC SCORE CHALLENGE!



What is a graphic score? - Graphic scores were developed during the 20th century as a way to go beyond standard music notation. Instead of using a staff with notes, key signatures, or tempo markings, composers notated with symbols and art to get their ideas across.

Instructions: Create a graphic score to be performed by any solo musician or ensemble. The piece can be original, or it can be an arrangement based on your favorite song. The score can contain any amount of symbols, words, pictures, art or even a mix of standard music notation to convey the idea of the piece. No knowledge of composition or note reading is required - the music is up to the composer and performer's interpretation!

The piece should be a MINIMUM of 20 seconds long. Your work should also be named and submitted to austinsviolinshop.com along with a video performance of the piece. While not required, a legend or key that explains the meaning of the artwork/symbols is recommended to help your audience better understand the ideas of your piece.
